Central Community School Board Proposition (Bond)

Shall the Central Community School Board ("Board"), acting as the governing authority of the Central Community School System ("District"), incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of not exceeding \$35,000,000, in one or more series, to run not exceeding 20 years from date thereof, with interest at a rate of not exceeding 7% per annum, for the purpose of financing capital expenditures for school purposes for the District, including constructing, acquiring and/or improving schools and other school related facilities, together with equipment and furnishings therefor, including, to the extent feasible, those specific school projects set forth in the "Capital Improvement Plan" approved by the School Board on January 13, 2025, title to which shall be in the public; which bonds will be general obligations of the District and will be payable from ad valorem taxes to be levied and collected in the manner provided by Article VI, Section 33 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974 and statutory authority supplemental thereto, with no estimated increase in the millage rate to be levied in the first year of issue above the 23.65 mills currently being levied to pay General Obligation Bonds of the District?

Shall the amended Home Rule Charter (the “Charter”) for the City of Zachary (the “City”) prepared and submitted by the Home Rule Charter Commission be adopted, pursuant to Article VI, Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana, which amended Charter may be reviewed on the official website of the City (<https://www.cityofzachary.org/>) or may be obtained from the Clerk of the City Council, and which proposed amended Charter is hereby incorporated by reference and made a part of this Proposition?

Consolidated School District No. 3 Proposition No. 3 of 5 (Tax Renewal)

Shall Consolidated School District No. 1 of the Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana (the “District”), continue to levy a special tax of 5.99 mills on all property subject to taxation in the District (an estimated \$32,300,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of 10 years, beginning with the year 2027 and ending with the year 2036, for the purpose of paying and improving salaries and other benefits of public school employees?

Consolidated School District No. 1 Proposition No. 1 of 5 (Tax Renewal)

Shall Consolidated School District No. 1 of the Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana (the “District”), continue to levy a special tax of .72 mills on all property subject to taxation in the District (an estimated \$3,887,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of 10 years, beginning with the year 2027 and ending with the year 2036, for the purpose of supporting the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention Program of the East Baton Rouge Parish School Board, commonly referred to as the “I CARE” Program?

Consolidated School District No. 4 Proposition No. 4 of 5 (Tax Renewal)

Shall Consolidated School District No. 1 of the Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana (the “District”), continue to levy a special tax of 4.98 mills on all the property subject to taxation in the District (an estimated \$26,880,000 is reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of 10 years, beginning with the year 2028 and ending with the year 2037, for the purpose of giving additional support to the public elementary and secondary schools in said District by providing funds for the purpose of replacing reduced state and local receipts and operating and maintaining the public school system in said District?

Consolidated School District No. 2 Proposition No. 2 of 5 (Tax Renewal)

Shall Consolidated School District No. 1 of the Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana (the “District”), continue to levy a special tax of 1.04 mills on all property subject to taxation in the District (an estimated \$5,600,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of 10 years, beginning with the year 2027 and ending with the year 2036, for the purpose of operating and maintaining the public school system?

Consolidated School District No. 5 Proposition No. 5 of 5 (Tax Renewal)

Shall Consolidated School District No. 1 of the Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana (the “District”), continue to levy a special tax of 7.14 mills on all the property subject to taxation in the District (an estimated \$38,500,000 is reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year) for a period of 10 years, beginning with the year 2029 and ending with the year 2038, for the purpose of giving additional support to the public elementary and secondary schools in said District by providing funds for improving and maintaining salaries and benefits of public school employees in said District?

Parishwide Proposition (District Attorney East Baton Rouge Millage)

Shall the 19th Judicial Enforcement District of the Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana (the "District") be authorized to levy and collect a tax of four (4) mills on all the property subject to taxation in the District (an estimated \$24,400,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the Tax for an entire year) (the "Tax"), for a period of twenty (20) years, beginning with the year 2025 and ending with the year 2044, in accordance with Louisiana law, with the proceeds of the Tax (after paying reasonable and necessary costs and expenses of collecting and administering the Tax) to be dedicated and used for the purpose of providing funding for the office of the District Attorney for East Baton Rouge Parish?
