What Changed?

- ➔ You are still voting on **May 16**
- ➔ Early voting still opens this **Saturday, May 2**
- ➔ U.S. House Congressional races are affected
- ➔ State officials are still deciding what happens with those votes

What's on the Ballot?

- ➔ **U.S. Senate**
- ➔ **Public Service Commission (PSC)**
- ➔ **BESE**
- ➔ **5 Constitutional Amendments**
- ➔ **Local Elections**

What about the U.S. House Congressional Race?

- ➔ They will still appear on your ballot
- ➔ As of now, state officials say those votes are not expected to be counted

What should you do?

- ➔ Go vote
- ➔ **Vote early starting Saturday**
- ➔ **Vote all the way down the ballot**
- ➔ Your vote still counts
- ➔ **Get 5 other people to vote with you!**

Bottom Line

- ➔ Your vote is your power
- ➔ Skipping this election is not an option
- ➔ Know before you go
