Concord Estates Crime Prevention Proposition

Shall Concord Estates Crime Prevention District (the "District") be authorized to levy and collect an annual parcel fee of Sixty Nine and 50/100 (\$69.50) on each lot, subdivided portion of ground, or individual tract not meaning a "condominium parcel" (With respect to the Condominiums are situated and not on individual condominium units) as defined in R.S. 9:1121.103 in the District identified by an individual assessment number of the rolls of East Baton Rouge Parish, for the period of six (6) years beginning with the year 2026 and ending with the year 2031, with proceeds of the parcel fee (an estimated \$20,433 is reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the parcel fee for an entire year), for the purpose of aiding in crime prevention and adding to the security of the District?

What happens if you vote "YES"?

Each household will pay \$69.50 a year to aid in the crime prevention and security of the neighborhood.

What happens if you vote "NO"?

There will be no additional fee and the district will lose out on an estimated \$20,433 each year.

Downtown Development District Proposition

Shall the Metropolitan Council of the Parish of East Baton Rouge and City of Baton Rouge, acting as governing authority of the Downtown Development District of the City of Baton Rouge, be authorized to renew the levy and collection of a ten (10) mills ad valorem tax on all property subject to taxation within the boundaries of the Downtown Development District of the City of Baton Rouge (the "Tax") (an estimated \$741,390 is reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the Tax for an entire year), for a period of five (5) years, beginning with the tax collection for the year 2027, and annually thereafter to and including the year 2031, and shall the proceeds of said Tax (after paying the reasonable and necessary expenses of collecting and administering the Tax, if any), be used entirely and exclusively for the planning, development, management, operation and improvement of the facilities, public improvements and services of the Downtown Development District of the City of Baton Rouge?

What happens if you vote "YES"?

You agree to renew a property tax for 5 more years. This tax would be collected only from properties inside the Downtown Development District. The money would be used only for Downtown Baton Rouge improvements — things like parks, sidewalks, lighting, events, and public spaces.

What happens if you vote "NO"?

Entities currently paying this tax would no longer be required to, and the Downtown Development District would lose out on about \$741,390 a year.

Southern Heights Neighborhood Crime Prevention and Improvement District Proposition

Shall the Southern Heights Neighborhood Crime Prevention and Improvement District ("District"), be authorized to renew, levy and collect the annual parcel fee on each improved and unimproved parcel within the District for a period of ten years, beginning in 2026 and ending in 2035, in the amount not to exceed \$100 per year and to increase the fee once after at least five years provided said fee does not exceed \$150 per year, as provided in La. R.S. 33:9097.21 with the proceeds of the parcel fee (after deducting administrative costs) to be used to aid in crime prevention and to add to the security of District residents, and to serve the needs of the residents of the District by funding beautification and improvements for the overall betterment of the District (an estimated \$51,800 is reasonably expected to be collected from the initial collection)?

What happens if you vote "YES"?

Each household will pay an amount not to exceed \$100 a year to aid in the crime prevention and security of the neighborhood. This measure would allow the District to increase the fee again once after 5 years, but could not exceed \$150.

What happens if you vote "NO"?

There will be no additional fee and the district will lose out on an estimated \$51,800 each year.
