



# We Demand VOTING RIGHTS Now!

60 years ago the federal government passed the Voting Rights Act, a landmark piece of civil rights legislation that granted equal voting rights to all citizens regardless of skin color. But, over time, conservative courts and legal activists have chipped away at these protections.

Recent court decisions, including **Louisiana v. Callais** shows that voters of color can lose representation even when the harm is clear. **We can no longer rely only on federal legislation to protect our fundamental voting rights. It is time to act.**

## Why does Louisiana need a Voting Rights Act?

A Louisiana State Voting Rights Act (VRA) would give the state its own tools to protect voters and communities, including:

- ➔ **Stopping voter suppression** and discriminatory practices before harm spreads
- ➔ Preventing **unfair and racially diluted voting maps**
- ➔ **Requiring transparency** when election rules change
