Justice of the Peace Ward 9

Justices of the Peace are part-time small claim judges who have limited jurisdiction to settle disputes involving less than \$5,000, collect money, handle disputes between Landlords and Tenants, and act as ex-officio Notaries Public on bills of sale and donations and other limited matters. Justices of the Peace may also perform marriage ceremonies and can also sometimes clear up title to cars, motorcycles, boats, and trailers.
