Constitutional Amendments

One of the core principles of the Power Coalition's People's Agenda is "Fiscal Fairness"--the idea that the state shouldn't balance its budget on the backs of working families. **We urge you to vote 'No' on Amendments 4, 5 & 7 because they violate that principle.**

Amendment 4 places an artificial cap on state spending. Amendment 5 would strip local control of the Industrial Tax Exemption Program (ITEP), which is a program that provides corporate tax giveaways at the expense of public education and other critical services. Amendment 7 would take a source of funding away from the state General Fund.
