Parishwide Proposition No. 1 of 6 - 4.74 Mills Renewal - PC - 10 Yrs. (Library Millage Renewal)

Shall Caddo Parish, Louisiana (the "Parish"), be authorized to continue to levy a special tax of 4.74 mills on all property subject to taxation in Caddo Parish (an estimated \$8,824,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of 10 years, beginning with the year 2024 and ending with the year 2033 (the "Tax"), for the purpose of acquiring, equipping, constructing, improving, maintaining and operating (including acquisition of library books, material and equipment) the public library system, including branches thereof, in and for said Parish?

Parishwide Proposition No. 6 of 6 - \$20M Bond - PC - 20 Yrs. (Bond)

Shall Caddo Parish, Louisiana (the "Parish"), incur debt and issue bonds not exceeding \$20,000,000, in one or more series, to run not exceeding 20 years from the date thereof, with interest at a rate not exceeding 8% per annum, for the purpose of the expansion and renovation of the Walter B. Jacobs Nature Park and other capital improvements, together with acquiring all necessary land, equipment and furnishings, which bonds will be general obligations of the Parish and will be payable from ad valorem taxes to be levied and collected in the manner provided by Article VI, Section 33 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974 and statutory authority supplemental thereto, with no estimated increase in the millage rate to be levied in the first year of issue above the 1.50 mills currently being levied to pay General Obligation Bonds of the Parish?
