Parishwide Proposition - 1.06 Mills Renewal - MC - 10 Yrs.

Shall the Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana (the "Parish") be authorized to renew the levy and collection of a 1.06 mill ad valorem tax (the "Tax") (an estimated \$5,251,300 is reasonably expected to be collected from the levy of the Tax for an entire year), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the tax collection for the year 2024, and annually thereafter to and including the year 2033, and shall the proceeds of the Tax be used entirely and exclusively to provide funds to purchase, maintain and operate machinery, facilities and equipment necessary and useful in the eradication, abatement or control of mosquitoes, other arthropods of public health importance and rodents, title to which shall be in the public, and maintaining and providing for adequate administrative and support staff in connection therewith?
